Preparation Class for the Certified Quality Auditor Exam

10 sessions, 1.5 hours/session Price \$450.00/attendee

The Certified Quality Auditor is a professional who understands the standards and principles of auditing and the auditing techniques of examining, questioning, evaluating, and reporting to determine a quality system's adequacy and deficiencies. The Certified Quality Auditor analyzes all elements of a quality system and judges its degree of adherence to the criteria of industrial management and quality evaluation and control systems.

Preparation Class for the Certified Manager of Quality/Organizational Excellence Exam

15 sessions, 1.5 hour/session Price \$675.00/attendee

The Certified Manager of Quality/Organizational Excellence is a professional who leads and champions process-improvement initiatives-everywhere from small businesses to multinational corporations-that can have regional or global focus in a variety of service and industrial settings. A Certified Manager of Quality/Organizational Excellence facilitates and leads team efforts to establish and monitor customer/supplier relations, supports strategic planning and deployment initiatives, and helps develop measurement systems to determine organizational improvement. The Certified Manager of Quality/Organizational Excellence should be able to motivate and evaluate staff, manage projects and human resources, analyze financial situations, determine and evaluate risk and employ knowledge management tools and techniques in resolving organizational challenges.

Preparation Class for the Certified Quality Engineer Exam

28 Sessions, 1.5 hours/session Price \$850.00/attendee

The Certified Quality Engineer is a professional who understands the principles of product and service quality evaluation and control. This body of knowledge and applied technologies include, but are not limited to, development and operation of quality control systems, application and analysis of testing and inspection procedures, the ability to use metrology and statistical methods to diagnose and correct improper quality control practices, an understanding of human factors and motivation, facility with quality cost concepts and techniques, and the knowledge and ability to develop and administer management information systems and to audit quality systems for deficiency identification and correction.

Upcoming 2024 Educational Offerings

Lean Six Sigma Green Belt

15 sessions, 3 hours/session Price \$1250/attendee

Are you a Problem Solver, by job requirements or by natural inclination? Do you find yourself fixing these problems, only to have them resurface? Do you want to learn the tools that will fix these issues and prevent them from re-occurring? If so, the Lean Six Sigma Green Belt class is for you.

This class is not just for those who wish to gain the ASQ certification (although it does cover all of the information you will need to prepare for the Green Belt certification exam). Along with the required information, there will be a much greater in-depth view of the Lean tools that work well in each phase of the D-M-A-I-C process. The topics to be covered are: Intro to Lean Six Sigma, 5S, Visual Workplace, Define, Measure, Process Mapping, Value Stream Mapping, Analyze, Flow, Improve, Overall Equipment Effectiveness, Rapid Changeover, Control, and Error Proofing.

The class is an interactive discovery, with hands on applications of some of the topics. At the conclusion of the course, you will be well situated to work as a Green Belt in your organization, and to certify as an ASQ Green Belt.

Six Sigma Black Belt

25 hours over 9 weeks plus 5 hours project mentoring Price \$2000/attendee

This course is designed to provide further training to those who have already received a certificate of completion for the ASQ Six Sigma Green Belt course. The students will receive more in depth training in more advanced tools that will be needed to execute the DMAIC process at the Black Belt level. The curriculum will prepare the students for the ASQ Black Belt certification exam. Prior to applying for the exam, applicants need to complete two projects at the Black Belt level.

The class will consist of periods of combined classroom work, and independent project work. Our Master Black Belt will assist the trainees with their initial project. The cost for this class includes 5 hours of individual mentoring during the project.

Each candidate should come to the class with a valid project. Project information should be submitted for review along with the course application. Applicants without projects may apply, as it may be possible to team up with another student. All teaming will be subject to instructor and company approval. Students from the same company may work in pairs, but groups of more than two will not be allowed. The project scope must be of sufficient size to allow both to develop their skills. Completion of this course will require presentations on the status of the project, as well as a completed final report.

Increase awareness of ASQ/RIASQ and provide opportunities to increase knowledge and develop careers for young professionals.

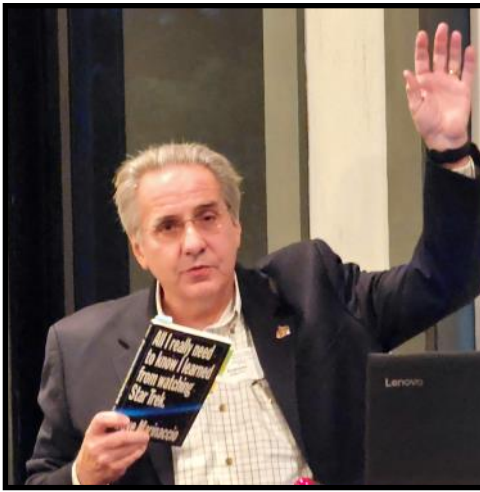
Committee Initial Goals

3. Participate in marketing strategy development with the broader RIASQ section

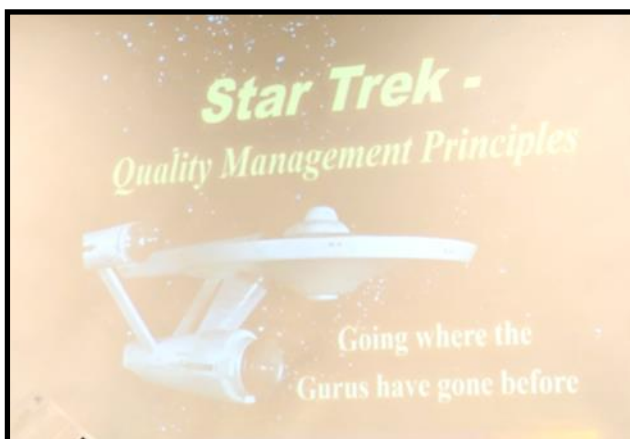

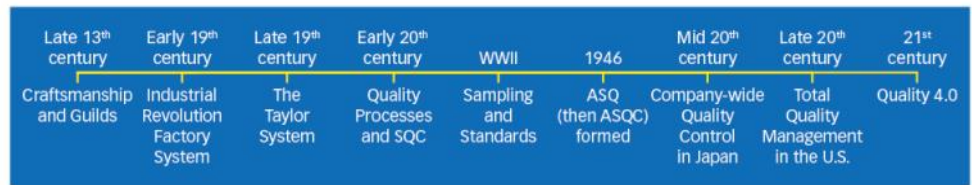
Need RU Credits?

Quality Through History



Quality in the early 20th century

The beginning of the 20th century marked the inclusion of "processes" in quality practices. A "process" is defined as a group of activities that takes an input, adds value to it, and provides an output. Walter Shewhart began to focus on controlling processes in the mid-1920s, making quality relevant not only for the finished product but for the processes that created it.

Shewhart recognized that industrial processes yield data. Shewhart determined this data could be analyzed using statistical techniques to see whether a process is stable and in control, or if it is being affected by special causes that should be fixed. In doing so, Shewhart laid the foundation for control charts, a modern-day quality tool.

W. Edwards Deming, a statistician with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and Census Bureau, became a proponent of Shewhart's SQC methods and later became a leader of the quality movement in both Japan and the United States.
